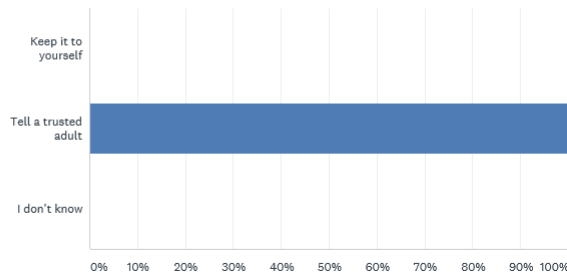
A sample of children from KS1 used Survey Monkey to answer questions based on SMSC.

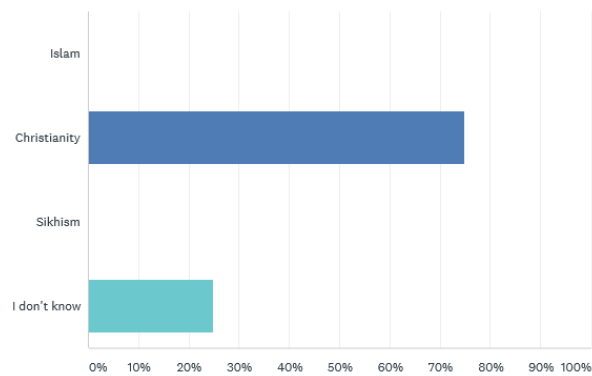

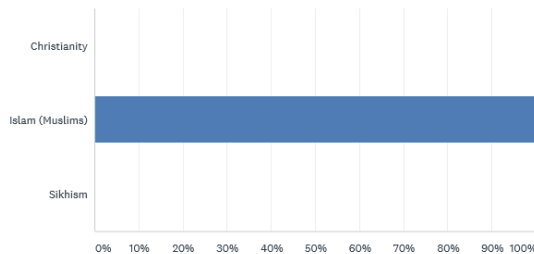
75% of children knew that the Bible belongs to Christianity.

Actions:

- Consider RE starters where children have to name basic facts about the religion they are focusing on e.g. What is their religious book?
- Ensure resources are used for educating children on different family make- ups e.g. two mummies/two daddies. Change wording of question for future surveys based on subject knowledge rather than personal experiences.
- Children were very confident at using this format; however, they were restricted to show their full understanding due to amount of questions available/multiple choice options. Consider still having some questions, which the SMSC lead asks, and notes down e.g. questions linked to the SMART Code etc.
