**Number of responses Summer 2018:** 33 (Parents were given two weeks to complete the survey online. The low amount of responses could be due to completing it online and there being no prize incentive like previous years).

### Action for 2018-2019

- Remind parents of where to find how all these areas are addressed/covered in our curriculum on the school website.
- Send out SMSC/British Values guide again to parents.
- Consider delivering thematic assemblies, linked to aspects of SMSC, to invite parents in to watch. These could be linked to the current performance poetry assemblies.
- Continue to deliver themed weeks: British Values, Share Aware, Expect Respect and Healthy Lifestyles Week but ensure parents are informed on Facebook/the website/via text and email
- Continue to promote value of the month.
- Continue to invite individuals into classes/assemblies to promote a range of religions/cultures e.g. Christianity, Sikhism etc. Also individuals with different abilities/ from different walks of life.
- Continue to offer CPD training to all members of staff.
- Look at how we can embed mental health into the curriculum.
- Keep up to date with the latest resources which address these areas.
