Reading and Listening Games

This term, the school starters will be focussing on letter sounds from our Read, Write Inc programme in preparation for school. Our non school starters will be taking part in daily listening games. This will include listening to 'FRED TALK'. Fred talk is a phonics technique within the Read Write Inc. (RWI) program where a toy frog named Fred introduces children to blending sounds to read words. Fred the Frog can only say the individual sounds within a word, and the child's role is to blend these sounds together to say the complete word. For example, Fred might say "c" and the child would respond with the word "cat".



Physical Development
